Michigan Saves Awarded for Its Impact

The Midwest Energy Efficiency Alliance announced the winners of its [2017 Inspiring Efficiency Awards](#), which recognized organizations that have delivered groundbreaking advancements in energy efficiency in five categories. Residential Network member Michigan Saves received an award in the “impact” category, which was presented to an organization that made significant contributions to market transformation through program implementation or policy change.



Michigan Saves provides a statewide network of authorized contractors with expertise in energy efficiency and onsite renewable energy systems; offers innovative, affordable financing through a network of authorized lenders; and accelerates demand for greater efficiency through education and communication. SELF Surpasses \$5 Million in Home Energy Upgrade Lending

Residential Network member the [Solar and Energy Loan Fund](#) (SELF), a nonprofit clean energy financing provider for low- and moderate-income Florida households, surpassed \$5 million in total lending for home upgrades in 2016. Since its creation in 2010, SELF has enabled more than 600 homeowners to affordably upgrade their homes and lower their energy costs.



After receiving \$2.9 million in seed funding as a [DOE Better Buildings Neighborhood Program](#) grantee in 2010, St. Lucie County, Florida, established SELF and leveraged that investment to attract additional capital, including mission-driven investments from community banks, foundations, impact investors, faith-based organizations, and worldwide crowdfunding.
