NEPA Categorical Exclusion Determination Form

Program or Field Office: U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of Legacy Management (LM)

Project Title: Temporary Space Assessment and Construction at Building 7, Grand Junction Site, Colorado

Location: Grand Junction, Colorado, Site

Proposed Action or Project Description:

LM is proposing to assess the condition of Building 7, develop a list of items needing repair, conduct the repairs, and prepare to make the building usable for staff occupancy. To accomplish this task, the Legacy Management Support (LMS) contractor is proposing to procure a Design-Build (DB) subcontractor to assess Building 7 and develop a list of items that are deficient, not working, or not in compliance with code, along with recommendations and costs to repair, replace, or construct to be able to have occupants in the building by the end of 2020 or the beginning of 2021 (date subject to change). Building 7 has been in cold storage for several years (unoccupied) and would need to be prepared for the safe occupancy of 47 offices and cubicles and storage space. The planned duration for the use of this building would be 5 years.

Coordination would be needed between the DB subcontractor, the LMS contractor, and other LMS subcontractors to address both interior and exterior building components. It is anticipated that the following activities would occur to determine the quality of Building 7 for occupancy:

- Conduct a facility study and assessment to determine the adequacy of the building for worker occupation
- Develop detailed architectural and engineering design and construction plans and specifications where major modifications are required based on the facility study
- Renovate Building 7 so that it meets the requirements of the DB subcontractor-provided assessment
- Install new cubicles and partition furniture and provide power and data runs to each cubicle and office space as indicated on the attached layout plan
- Install door and window access controls
- Construct American Disability Association-compliant parking surface and sidewalks to the building
- Improve the building stormwater drainage system on the east side of the building

Existing exterior infrastructure (gas, water, sewer, electric) are assumed to be in good condition and would not be included in the proposed action.

Work is anticipated to begin in 2020 or 2021 (date subject to change) and would be performed using the DB subcontractor to perform the scope of work. The LMS contractor would also be procuring other subcontractors to perform door access controls, window controls, and furniture.

This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized by the LM Director per DOE Policy 451.1), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified classes of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
