B5.1 Actions to conserve energy, demonstrate potential energy conservation, and promote energy-efficiency that do not increase the indoor concentrations of potentially harmful substances. These actions may involve financial and technical assistance to individuals (such as builders, owners, consultants, designers), organizations (such as utilities), and state and local governments. Covered actions include, but are not limited to: programmed lowering of thermostat settings, placement of timers on hot water heaters, installation of solar hot water systems, installation of efficient lighting, improvements in generator efficiency and appliance efficiency ratings, development of energy-efficient manufacturing or industrial practices, and small-scale conservation and renewable energy research and development and pilot projects. The actions could involve building renovations or new structures in commercial, residential, agricultural, or industrial sectors. These actions do not include rulemakings, standard-settings, or proposed DOE legislation.

Rational for determination:

This NEPA determination (GFO-09-332-005) is a result of a previous NEPA determination (GFO-09-332). OK's Department of Commerce would pass DOE share funding to Metropolitan Tulsa Transit Authority ("MTTA"). MTTA would use DOE funding to pay for the incremental cost of purchasing up to 14 CNG buses and conversion of 30 existing buses from diesel to CNG.

In the performance of work in all program areas, grantees will be required to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and standards, including but not limited to the handling, storage, transportation and disposal of waste. If a grantee proposes work that may affect an historic property or archaeological resource listed in or determined to be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, the grantee will be required to comply with the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
