Proposed Action Title: Palo Alto Research Center (PARC) - Large-Area Thermoelectric Generators (LATEGs) for Low-Grade Waste Heat Harvesting

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Palo Alto, CA (PARC); Raleigh, NC (Novus); Research Triangle Park, NC (MDDI)

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support PARC's plan to create a thermoelectric (TE) module manufacturing process that is 1-3 times cheaper than current conventional processes by leveraging PARC's Co-Extrusion (CoEx) printing technology to create highly-effective Large-Area Thermoelectric Generator (LATEG) modules capable of efficiently converting waste heat directly into electrical energy.

Project tasks will involve creating thermoelectric (TE) pastes using ink and powdered elements; printing the pastes onto substrates devised with electrical connections; planarizing and sintering the paste into strips; and testing the TE performance of the strips. All research will be conducted in lab facilities in Palo Alto, CA; Raleigh, NC; and Research Triangle Park, NC.

Project work will be performed by trained personnel and comply with applicable federal, state, and local requirements. No modifications will be made to existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.

The proposal fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
