Proposed Action Title: The George Washington University. -- Transfer Printed Virtual Substrates

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Washington, DC; Durham, NC

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's small-scale research and development activities to utilize a novel manufacturing strategy to produce virtual substrates enabling concentrated photovoltaics (CPV) to achieve a cost of electricity below \$0.04/kWh, enabling it to compete with current market prices of \$0.07-\$0.12/kWh. Specifically, the project team will (1) complete the epitaxial growth of many periods of stacked virtual substrate layers and (2) utilize a key enabling technology called micro-transfer printing (MTP) to transfer these layers from the source substrate to a low-cost target. If successful, the technology will reduce the cost of applicable substrates from approximately \$150 to less than \$10. By using the same substrate many times for growth of multiple PV cells, they will conserve both cost and expensive and environmentally sensitive materials, such as GaAs (Gallium Arsenide) and similar semiconductors.

Project activities will be conducted at an existing facility at the George Washington University (Washington, DC), US Naval Research Laboratory (Washington, DC), and X-Celeprint (Durham, NC), designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to the existing facility to accommodate the proposed work.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
