AMENDED NEPA DETERMINATION: (See attached original Determination, dated June 30, 2017)

This follows the approval of additional funds to support Tour Engine's small-scale, R&D activities to develop a novel high efficiency, low emissions, and low cost internal combustion engine with an ultimate goal to be implemented as a micro combined heat and power system. Specifically, the project team will (1) further develop a 5kW engine using a novel Two-Stage Compression (TSC) approach to improve efficiency and lower emissions; and (2) prepare the engine for use in a combined heat and power system, including all ancillary and electrical systems. If successful, the team will produce a pre-production engine integrated into combined heat and power system with high net electric efficiency and California Air Resources Board Distributed Generation emissions compliance, including ultra-low NOx.

Project activities will be conducted on a small-scale basis in existing dedicated laboratory, testing, and fabrication facilities at WERC (Madison, WI); Next Step Engineering Solutions (Bonita, CA); and Tour Engine, Inc. (San Diego, CA). Project tasks continue to fit under the DOE Categorical Exclusion identified below and do not involve any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the project. This assessment was based on a review of the proposed scope of work and the potential environmental impact of the project. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements.
