Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to the Pacific Ocean Energy Trust (POET) to administer the Testing and Access for Marine Energy Research (TEAMER) program. The primary objective of TEAMER is to provide marine hydrokinetic (MHK) technology developers access to a network of United States based testing facilities which provide testing and modeling expertise. Access would be provided through competitively awarded funds awarded under TEAMER and administered by POET. POET would be advised by a Technical Board which would include representatives from DOE, DOE National Labs, and National Marine Renewable Energy Centers. There would be up to nine funding cycles.

The proposed project would be divided into 4 tasks. DOE has previously completed seven NEPA reviews covering tasks 1, 2, and subtask 3.1 (GFO-0008895-001 CX A9; 11/14/2019), subtasks 3.2, 3.3.1 to 3.3.9, 3.4, and task 4. (GFO-0008895-002 CX A9, B3.6, B5.15; 07/22/2020; GFO-0008895-003 CX A9, B3.6, B5.15; 10/22/2020; GFO-0008895-005 CX A9, A11, B3.6, B5.15; 03/30/2021; GFO-0008895-006 CX A9, A11, B3.6, B5.15; 04/01/2021; GFO-0008895-007 CX A9, A11, B3.6, B5.15; 05/03/2021).

The recipient has received additional funds through a Determination of Noncompetitive Financial Assistance (DFNA), permitting the recipient to extend previously approved activities and add new project activities. The new tasks that have been added/modified are administrative in nature and are listed below:

Under Task 1: Establish the TEAMER Program, Deliverable 1.1.2 has been added which is that standard operating procedure (SOP) for RFTS calls will be developed and submitted to DOE for review and approval in coordination with the Technical Board.

Subtask 1.2: Communications/Marketing Plan, Risk Management Plan, and Diversity Equity and Inclusion Plan has been expanded to ensure clear and effective communication throughout the TEAMER project and to include a diversity, equity, and inclusion plan. This results in an update of Deliverable 1.2.1 regarding communications and marketing and a new Deliverable 1.2.5 to submit the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Plan.

Additional information has been included under Subtask 1.6.0: Periodic Review of Test Facility Network. Milestone 1.6.1 has been changed to Annual Facility Network Summit. Deliverable 1.6.2: Annual Facility Network Summit Reports has been added.

Subtask 1.7.0 was added: Establish TEAMER Media and Software Tools to increase efficiency of the RFTS review process. Deliverable 1.7.1 was added to verify additional software tools.

Subtask 1.8, Create Technical Board Charter, was previously numbered as subtask 2.5 and subtask 1.9, Annual Technical Board Summit, was previously numbered as subtask 2.6. As such, these subtasks were reviewed in a prior NEPA determination.

Task 3 has been expanded to offer educational and training opportunities to the marine energy sector.

Subtask 3.4 was changed to establish an education and training component of TEAMER, in which the Network Director would work to identify areas for short technical assistance courses and administrative instructional training courses. Related deliverables 3.4.1 and milestones 3.4.1 and 3.4.2 were added.

Subtask 3.5, Announce Accomplishments and Events, was previously numbered as 3.4. As such, this subtask was reviewed in a prior NEPA determination.

Subtask 3.6 was added: Establish a loaner pool of testing instrumentation in which network facilities may be allowed to purchase necessary instrumentation to increase capabilities for carrying out specific tests. Related deliverable and milestone were added.

Subtask 3.7 was added: Increase RFTS review capabilities, the Network Direct, along with the Technical Board will identify new reviewers and team leads to help carry out the RFTS review process.

Deliverable 4.1.2 under Subtask 4.1 was added: RFTS Reporting includes uploading all existing RFTS data into Submittable, therefore increasing reporting capabilities.

Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.
