Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination	Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Small- scale research and development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects	Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) in support of Budget Period 3 of UCLA's existing award "Energy Where it Matters: Delivering Heat to the Membrane/Water Interface for Enhanced Thermal Desalination". DOE completed a NEPA review for Budget Periods 1 and 2 on 8/20/2018 (CX A9 and B3.6, GFO-0008391-001). At the time of the original NEPA determination there was not enough information available to conduct a meaningful review of Budget Period 3. This information is now available and this NEPA Determination applies to all Budget Period 3 activities.

Budget Period 3 activities would include expanding the model developed in Budget Periods 1 and 2, construction and field testing of a demonstration-scale desalination system, and completing the techno-economic analysis. Design and development activities would take place at UCLA and Colorado School of Mines (CSM). Field testing and demonstration would take place at CSM's We2st Water Technology Hub located in Denver, CO. Field testing and demonstration activities would include operating the demonstration-scale (approximately 1 square meter) desalination system to treat pretreated oil and gas wastewater generated from the Permian Basin and delivered to CSM. The demonstration system would be operated for a minimum of three months.

Project work would occur within existing dedicated facilities designed for this type of work and would utilize standard equipment; therefore no modifications, new permits, additional licenses and/or authorizations would be necessary. No ground disturbing activities, no changes in operation of existing facilities, and no installation of equipment outdoors would occur for project activities. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities.
