Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have made the following determination:

Description:

B5.23 Electric vehicle charging stations The installation, modification, operation, and removal of electric vehicle charging stations, using commercially available technology, within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions are limited to areas where access and parking are in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Nevada Department of Administration to construct an electric vehicle (EV) charging station. The proposed project is part of the Nevada Electric Highway Project, and the Nevada Department of Administration, Fleet Services Administration is the sub-recipient and would be responsible for the installation of the charging station. The charging station would be comprised of one pedestal type charger and would be installed in an existing parking lot. The charger would include one dual-port Level 2 Charger.

The charging station would be located in the parking lot of the Richard H. Bryan State Office Building located at 901 S. Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada. Necessary project activities would include the construction of a concrete pad and the placement of EV charging equipment (pedestal), installation of electrical conduit, trenching and repair of existing concrete curbing and asphalt parking surface, electric panel upgrades and additional electrical enhancements to accommodate the fast charger higher voltage requirements, and necessary lighting and parking striping.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Endangered Species Program website (iPaC) identifies one threatened species that is known or believed to be present in Carson City, Nevada. Due to the lack of habitat in the vicinity of the site, DOE has determined the proposed project would have no effect on the threatened species in the area. iPaC also identifies 24 Birds of Conservation Concern known or believed to be present in Carson City, Nevada. Impacts to migratory birds are anticipated to be insignificant due to the previously developed/urban setting of the project site.

The project would be located outside of the 100-year floodplain. The Nevada Governor's Office of Energy with the Nevada State Historic Preservation Officer determined that no historic properties would be affected as a result of this undertaking, per the programmatic agreement between DOE, the Nevada State Office of Energy and the Nevada State Historic Preservation Officer.

Based on a review of the project information and the above analysis, DOE has determined that the proposed project would not have a significant individual or cumulative impact to human health and/or environment. DOE has determined that this project is consistent with actions outlined in DOE categorical exclusions B5.23 "Electric vehicle charging stations" and is therefore categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

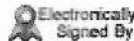
