Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to the University of Texas at Austin (UT) for the development of an "innovation pipeline" to support geothermal related startups and advance technology readiness levels of new geothermal related innovations and inventions in an effort to help drive down the risks and cost of high temperature deep drilling sufficiently to enable widespread deployment of Enhanced Geothermal Systems (EGS). Project work would include technology and capability surveys across multiple entities, and support and mentorship of startup companies. Activities would consist of information gathering, surveys and reviews of innovations related to high temperature downhole technologies, startup team recruitment and formation, database and educational material creation, and startup company support and mentorship. All project activities would consist exclusively of intellectual, academic, or analytical activities and would not include manufacturing, fabrication, modification of facilities, or field work.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
