Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

**A9** Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, Information gathering, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Colusa Indian Community Council for the design, procurement, and installation of an expansion of their existing medium-voltage distribution to more than 30 households, a daycare, a mechanical shop, irrigation pumps, and a sewer lift station, which currently receive electric service from the local electric utility. As part of the project automatic meter reading (AMR) and advanced metering infrastructure (AMI) would be installed to allow the Tribe to set up its own electric metering and billing like a utility.

Task 1 of the project is for engineering and design of the underground 12.47 kV distribution system and secondary service as well as the AMI and AMR. At this time, there is not enough information to complete a review of the proposed project activities. Once additional details of project engineering and design are completed, another NEPA review will be required to assess potential impacts associated with the construction and surface disturbing activities of the project.
