Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. (See also B3.1 of appendix B to this subpart.)

B3.6 Small-scale research and development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to Redox Power Systems, LLC (Redox) for the design, development, laboratory testing, and demonstration of the technical and economic feasibility of a thin-film multilayer-electrolyte solid oxide electrolyte cell that utilizes proton-conducting electrolyte materials (P-SOEC). Project work would occur at Redox's laboratory and office incubator space leased from the University of Maryland in College Park, MD over a three-year period. Additionally, collaboration is expected to occur with the HydroGEN Energy Materials Network Consortium.

Project activities include P-SOEC proof of concept, initial performance optimization, long term degradation mitigation, and long term durability optimization. Modeling of P-SOEC fabrication and operating costs would also be completed. All activities would occur in office space or existing laboratories designed for this type of work that would utilize standard laboratory equipment; therefore no modifications, new permits, additional licenses and/or authorizations would be necessary. No ground disturbing activities, no changes in the operation of existing facilities, and no installation of equipment outdoors would occur for project activities. The project would involve the use and handling of various hazardous materials, including ceramics and industrial solvents. All such handling would occur in-lab with dedicated proper hazardous material handling and disposal practices to ensure these materials would pose no risk to the public. All hazardous materials would be managed in accordance with Federal, state, and local environmental regulations. Redox arranges hazardous waste generation training and disposal through the University of Maryland's Environmental Health and Safety department. During operation, the P-SOEC devices would convert water to hydrogen, which would either be burned to form water vapor or simply ventilated. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

FOR CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATIONS

The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
