Description:

A9 Information gathering,

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Smallscale **laboratory** operations, and pilot projects

Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and research and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a development, concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to Span.IO Inc (Span) to further develop the "Span Load Center," a residential electrical panel with metering and circuit controls designed specifically for the residential solar photovoltaic (PV) and battery storage industry.

The technical scope of the proposed project is to design and fabricate a series of iterative prototypes to test, de-risk, and inform the form, fit, function, and cost of new hardware. The project would be divided into two Budget Periods (BP). BP1 would involve early-stage prototypes and BP2 would involve production-intent prototypes. Associated activities would include outreach and customer engagement throughout the course of the project.

Project management, data analysis, design, development, prototype assembly, and some testing activities would occur at Span's offices and laboratory space in San Francisco, CA. Certification-ready product testing and validation would be performed by various third-party and/or nationally recognized test laboratories. All work would be performed in dedicated research and development (R&D) facilities, using a combination of existing equipment and specialty parts and supplies obtained for the proposed fabrication activities.

Materials and methods used by the proposed project would be non-hazardous, limited in scale, and consistent with past and ongoing R&D at Span. The delivery of parts and supplies is expected to produce minor quantities of cardboard and plastic waste that would be recycled if possible. All other equipment and materials used or produced by the project would be retained for future use.
