Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information analysis, and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and dissemination informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to Northeastern University (NEU) to develop machine learning measurement software for solar photovoltaic (PV) distribution system applications. The software would interpret raw data from PV systems to provide state estimates and real-time model feedback. Existing PV system data would be used for algorithm development and modeling. The project would be completed over three Budget Periods (BPs), with a Go/No-Go Decision Point in between each BP.

NEU would coordinate all project work. Proposed activities would include data analysis, algorithm development, computer modeling/simulations, software validation testing, and reporting. Raw data would be provided by utility partners. Project work would not involve any hardware development or testing. All activities would be performed at office facilities operated by NEU and project partners University of Massachusetts-Lowell, Brandeis University, and ComEd.

The proposed project would consist solely of intellectual, academic, and/or analytical activities. All project activities would be conducted from existing offices or computational facilities and use no materials beyond basic office supplies, software, and computer hardware.
