A. Brief Description of Proposal: Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), Rocky Mountain Region (RMR), conducted emergency optical ground wire (OPGW) repairs on its existing Gore Pass-Hayden (GOT-HDN) 138-kV Transmission Line in Routt County, Colorado. This work was deemed an emergency because the damaged OPGW sections were at risk of breaking and contacting the conductor, potentially causing a power outage in addition to a communication outage. These emergency repairs were completed between Structures 45/5 and 46/4 and Structures 60/9 and 61/2 in October and November 2020. Prior to repairs, brush clearing was completed within a 50-foot radius of each affected transmission structure to facilitate safe access. Repair activities for both spans included pulling new OPGW into place from pulling sites positioned at opposite ends of each span. The replacement sections of OPGW were spliced into the existing OPGW at Structures 45/5, 46/4, 60/9, and 61/2. A new splice enclosure, anchors, and down guys were installed on Structure 45/5; new splice enclosures were installed on Structures 60/9 and 61/2. Equipment used for this project included ATVs/UTVs, brush hog, bucket trucks, skid-steer loaders, wire pullers and tensioners. cranes, splicing trailers, cable reel trailers, equipment trailers, and utility trucks. Work was confined to WAPA's (right-of-way) ROW on private lands and public lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management. The ROW was accessed by existing access routes; no access road maintenance or new road construction occurred.

This Categorical Exclusion (CX) covers work that has already been completed. No further work is authorized under this CX. If additional work is required, RMR's Environment Department must be contacted to determine whether additional environmental review is required.
