Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

### CX, EA, EIS APPENDIX AND NUMBER:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to Open Market ESCO LLC to design, develop, install and operate energy efficient technologies in various low and moderate income multifamily housing communities in Massachusetts.

This award would be executed in three budget periods (BPs). All activities identified in BP1 and listed under Task 8 have been reviewed in this NEPA Determination (ND). Budget period 2 and BP3 activities are dependent on data collected in BP1; therefore potential impacts of BP2 and BP3 cannot be reviewed at this time. Additional NEPA review of BP2 and BP3 activities will be required.

Budget period 1 includes tasks and subtasks 1 through 4 of the SOPO. It involves screening potential properties to participate in the project, identifying properties, computer modeling, research, analysis, plan development, data collection, engineering design, documenting plans and protocols, and obtaining permits and authorizations. Task 8 includes coordination and collaboration activities that would occur throughout all BPs.

All activities will be conducted in existing purpose-built office or laboratory settings. No installation, construction, or ground disturbing activities would occur in BP1 or Task 8.

DOE has made a conditional NEPA determination.
