Proposed Action Title: University of Houston -- Lithium- and Transition Metal-Free High-Energy Fast-Charging Batteries

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Houston, Texas; Columbia, Missouri; Ann Arbor, Michigan

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's small-scale research and development of a battery capable of matching the energy and power densities of lithium batteries without using lithium and transition metals (e.g., cobalt or nickel) in active materials, instead, replacing them with magnesium and other organic materials. Specifically, the project team will (1) develop combined magnesium and organic cathode materials, (2) test materials for conductivity and energy levels, (3) integrate materials into battery cell design, and (4) test battery functionality. If successful, this project will result in a battery design using magnesium and other materials that are readily available in the U.S. for use in electric vehicles and other transportation that currently uses lithium batteries.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities at University of Houston (Houston, TX), LiBeyond LLC, (Houston, TX), Twelfth Vertex, LLC (Columbia, MO), and Toyota Research Institute North America (Ann Arbor, MI), designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
