The Board of County Commissioners of Rio Blanco County, Colorado, urge you to approve the application to amend DOE/FE Order No. 4365 and the proposed increase in non-FTA export volume from 475 billion cubic feet per year to 636 billion cubic feet per year for the ECA Large-Scale Project.

Rio Blanco County, Colorado has a population of 6,668 people and covers approximately 3,200 square miles in northwest Colorado. Seventy-Five percent (75%) of Rio Blanco County is Federal land. Working to find a balance between managing resources under numerous laws and regulations, maximizing local participation in the process, recognizing and protecting private property rights and promoting economic development are critical to our western way of life. Rio Blanco County, Colorado has vast natural resources, including coal, natural gas, and timber. Additionally, Rio Blanco County has some of the oldest privately held ranches and agricultural operations in the state with vast outdoor recreational opportunities. Since its inception in 1889, our county has balanced agricultural, resource development, and recreation and boasts some of the cleanest air and water in the country. Due to the large amount of federal land, government legislation, policies and procedures directly impact our economic and cultural prosperity. The energy producers in Colorado generate approximately One Hundred Sixty Million in royalty revenues, of which over Forty Million comes from Rio Blanco County. The funds generated by energy producers benefit not only producing counties but the State of Colorado as a whole. The revenues collected from our oil and gas partners help to build infrastructure across the state.
