APPLICATION TO AMEND EXPORT TERM FOR EXISTING LONG-TERM AUTHORIZATIONS THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2050

Pursuant to Section 3 of the Natural Gas Act ("NGA"), 15 U.S.C. § 717b, and Part 590 of the regulations of the Department of Energy ("DOE"), 10 C.F.R. § 590, and DOE's Final Policy Statement regarding Extending Natural Gas Export Authorizations to Non-Free Trade Agreement Countries Through the Year 2050, Lake Charles LNG Export Company, LLC ("Lake Charles LNG Export") submits this Application to the DOE Office of Fossil Energy ("DOE/FE") for authorization to amend its existing authorizations to export liquefied natural gas ("LNG") from the terminal in Lake Charles, Louisiana ("Lake Charles Terminal").

SECTION I

1. FE Docket Number

This Application relates to DOE/FE Docket Nos. 13-04-LNG and 16-109-LNG.

2. Authorizations Holder & Service List

The exact legal name of the applicant is Lake Charles LNG Export Company, LLC. Lake Charles LNG Export is a limited liability company formed under the laws of Delaware with its principal place of business at 1300 Main Street, Houston, Texas 77002.

5. Final Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") Orders

FERC issued the NGA Section 3 authorization for the liquefaction facilities at the Lake Charles Terminal in *Lake Charles LNG Company, LLC, et al.*, 153 FERC ¶ 61,300 (December 17, 2015), *reh'g denied*, 155 FERC ¶ 61,328 (June 30, 2016). In addition, on May 6, 2022, FERC

granted a three-year extension of time, to December 17, 2028, to construct the project and make it available for service. *Lake Charles LNG Company, LLC, et al.*, 179 FERC ¶ 61,086 (2022).

6. Requested Amendment to Existing Export Term

Lake Charles LNG Export requests that DOE/FE grant an extension to the currently authorized export term of each of the Authorizations through December 31, 2050 (inclusive of any make-up period), with an attendant increase in the total export volume over the life of the Authorizations.

SECTION II

1. Information Regarding the Public Interest

Lake Charles LNG Export respectfully submits that the term extensions are justified under NGA Section 3. With respect to the FTA authorizations, NGA Section 3(c), as amended by Section 201 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Pub. L. 102-486), provides that:

[T]he exportation of natural gas to a nation with which there is in effect a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas, shall be deemed to be consistent with the public interest, and applications for such importation or exportation shall be granted without modification or delay.⁵

Under this statutory presumption, that portion of this Application that seeks to extend the FTA export terms, shall be deemed to be consistent with the public interest and should be granted by DOE/FE without modification or delay.

With respect to the Non-FTA authorizations, Lake Charles LNG Export incorporates by reference the Policy Statement, in which DOE/FE "considered its obligations under NGA section 3(a), the public comments supporting and opposing the Proposed Policy Statement, and a wide range of information bearing on the public interest" and adopted a standard export term through

December 31, 2050.⁶ Global events following the August 2020 publication of the Policy Statement have only further reinforced that the exportation of natural gas through December 31, 2050 will not be inconsistent with the public interest. In addition, the U.S. Energy Information Administration's Annual Energy Outlook for 2022 projects growing natural gas production in the United States through 2050, the requested term of the extensions sought herein.⁷

2. Compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969

DOE/FE fully considered the potential environmental impacts associated with exports from the Lake Charles Terminal in approving the existing Authorizations. In addition, FERC fully considered the potential environmental impacts when it issued the NGA Section 3 authorization for the Lake Charles Terminal.⁸ A categorical exclusion applies with respect to the instant Application because the request involves only an amendment to the term of the existing authorizations and does not involve any new construction or modifications to existing facilities.⁹ DOE's regulations provide a categorical exclusion for "[a]pprovals or disapprovals of new authorizations or amendments of existing authorizations to export natural gas under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act and any associated transportation of natural gas by marine vessel" as is the case with the authorizations requested in the instant Application.¹⁰ DOE/FE consistently has cited this categorical exclusion in granting requests to extend the export term of existing authorizations
