Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the University of Washington (UW) to upgrade and deploy hydrophone instrumentation which would collect noise data generated by wave energy converters (WECs). Deployments would occur at the PacWave South (PWS) test site.

This NEPA determination (ND) does not apply to Subtask 3.2.0, Task 4.0.0, or Budget Period (BP) 2. DOE will complete a NEPA review for these activities when sufficient information is available to conduct a meaningful review.

This ND applies to activities that would prepare hydrophone instrumentation and plans for deployment activities. The hydrophone instrumentation involved with this project would include Drifting Acoustic Instrumentation Systems (DAISYs) and a NoiseSpotter®, both of which have been deployed in previous DOE-funded activities. Three existing DAISYs would be upgraded and bench-tested at UW laboratories (Seattle, WA). UW would also fabricate two additional DAISYs. The NoiseSpotter® would be upgraded and bench-tested by Integral Consulting Inc. (Integral) at their existing facilities (Santa Cruz, CA). Upgrades would focus on improving the ability for instrumentation to collect noise data while also increasing the amount of time they can operate while deployed.

Additional activities would include those of an academic, intellectual, and analytical nature. This would include the preparation of plans and procedures for anticipated deployments at PWS.

All facilities at UW and Integral are preexisting purpose-built facilities for the type of work to be conducted for this award. Facility modifications would not be required. Award activities would involve hazards associated with engineering laboratory work, such as handling electronic components and tools for fabrication of equipment. All such handling and storage would occur within controlled laboratory settings. Existing university and corporate health, safety, and environmental policies and procedures would be followed at all facilities, including: personnel training, proper personal protective equipment (PPE), engineering controls, monitoring, and internal assessments.

DOE has considered potential impacts on resources, including those of an ecological, historical, cultural, and socioeconomic nature. DOE does not anticipate adverse impacts on these resources.
