Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Colusa Indian Community Council (Colusa, CA) to expand the Tribe's existing energy distribution system to seven new homes. This would include the addition of transformers, smart meters, and streetlights as well.

This award would be executed in five tasks carried out over one Budget Period (BP). All activities in Task 1 have been reviewed in this NEPA Determination (ND). Information obtained from Task 1 activities of the approved Statement of Project Objectives would inform the engineering and design details of the distribution system expansion and remaining project activities. At this time, there is not enough information to complete a review of Task 2-5 activities. Once additional details of project engineering and design are completed, another NEPA review will be required to assess potential impacts associated with the remaining project activities.

Task 1 activities are comprised of solely intellectual activities, including designing the underground distribution system, voltage systems for the new houses, advanced meter infrastructure, and street lighting.

All activities will be conducted in existing purpose-built office settings. No installation, construction, or ground disturbing activities would occur in Task 1.
