Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy is proposing to provide funding to the Wisconsin Office of Energy Innovation to install approximately 51.36 kW of ground mounted solar PV panels, four 10 kW inverters, with a protective fence at the Dunn County Historical Society History Museum in Menomonie, Wisconsin. The installation will be part of the Society's planned "Solar Victory Garden" which will be enhanced with educational signage and gardens surrounding the proposed solar array.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website identifies one candidate species (Monarch Butterfly), one threatened species (Northern Long-eared Bat) and two endangered species (Gray Wolf, Karner Blue Butterfly) that may occur in the project area. Several trees may be removed to accommodate the new Solar Victory Garden. For this reason, the project was evaluated and determined consistent with activities assessed in the USFWS' January 5, 2016 Programmatic Biological Opinion (PBO) applying to activities that may affect Northern Long-eared Bat. The proposed projects may affect the northern long-eared bat; however, any take that may occur as a result of the proposed project is not prohibited under the ESA Section 4(d) rule adopted for this species at 50 CFR §17.40(o). Karner Blue Butterflies would not be found at the project site as the species requires wild Lupin for most life cycles and the proposed site is mowed and manicured. The Gray wolf would not be impacted as this project is already within a developed area not suitable for wolf habitat. DOE has determined the proposed project would have no effect to Gray Wolves or Karner Blue Butterflies.

Installation of the proposed project may involve the use of heavy equipment and working with electricity. Potential hazards would be mitigated through adherence to established institutional health and safety policies and procedures. The Wisconsin Office of Energy Innovation would adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local health, safety, and environmental regulations. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

Any changes to the project activities or locations are subject to additional NEPA review by DOE and are not authorized for federal funding unless and until the Contracting Officer provides written authorization on those additions or modifications.
