Description:

#### Rationale for determination:

DOE is administering Congressionally Directed Spending to the Philadelphia Energy Authority (PEA) to fund the administrative, education, outreach, and audits of the Built to Last program. PEA has applied to receive funding under another DOE grant called the Enhancement & Innovation grant. Weatherization activities for the Built to Last program would be funded under the Enhancement & Innovation grant which would have a separate NEPA review. This current NEPA review is applicable to the only administrative activities required for the Built to Last program.

Proposed award activities include outreach, education, and engagement to screen households for the repair program. Auditing of program participants would occur, as well as advising residents on home health, maintenance, and energy efficiency. PEA would also work with partners to complete software enhancements according to information gained from the original pilot program, in order to improve communication, construction management, and home project activities. At first 50 homes would be identified and audited followed by another 150 homes, and lastly 250 final homes.
