
Peer Exchange Calls, Fall 2022, No. 35

The Northeast Energy Efficiency Partnership's Arah Schuur spoke to what she described as "the first rule of energy efficiency": don't sell energy efficiency. Instead, she suggested highlighting other benefits including comfort, environmental attributes, asset value, cool technology, and upfront cost savings.

Hear about the promising opportunity to combine space and water heating equipment.

Pacific Northwest National Laboratory's Edward Louie described the perfect match that exists between space conditioning and water heating as an integration opportunity. He noted that the operating temperatures of a heat pump for space conditioning are the same as the ideal temperatures for domestic water heating.







Discover the potential for the Inflation Reduction Act to stimulate residential efficiency.

The Stella Group's Scott Sklar highlighted plans to expand EV charging nationwide. The Federal Highway Administration, to take one example, has approved plans to build out a vast electric charging station network for all 50 states plus the District of Columbia.
