Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to authorize the administration of the "Equitable and Affordable Solutions to Electrification (EAS-E) Home Electrification Prize", a two-phase prize competition. The prize would provide cash and technical assistance toward the development and demonstration of advanced electrification retrofits for residential homes.

This ND only covers the development of concept papers, application submittal and winner selection activities identified in phase 1. Phase 2 of the prize would be dependent on the outcome of the concept papers and would require additional NEPA review.

Prize competition activities of any applicant selected within phase 1 would include only intellectual, academic, or analytical activities such as administrative and desktop activities. Based on the types of activities anticipated to occur as part phase 1 of the prize competition, DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern.

#### FOR CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATIONS

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
