Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Southeast Energy Efficiency Alliance Inc. (SEEA) to develop an educational program to increase awareness of the benefits of select advanced building technologies. Specifically, the program would focus on a suite of technologies which would include electric air source heat pumps, heat pump water heaters, electric vehicle charging systems, and battery storage systems. The program would be developed for manufacturers, state and local governments, utilities, and other relevant stakeholders. SEEA would develop the program and provide training to stakeholders in Florida, Georgia, and Virginia. The program would be developed over two Budget Periods (BPs), with a Go/No-Go Decision Point in between each BP. This NEPA Determination is applicable to both BPs.

Proposed project activities would include project planning, market research, stakeholder engagement, curriculum development, training delivery, and program monitoring and evaluation. Training would be delivered by SEEA personnel both in-person, in existing classroom settings, and virtually. No equipment testing or demonstrations would be performed. SEEA would adhere to established corporate health and safety policies and procedures and would observe all applicable Federal, state and local health, safety, and environmental regulations.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
