ORDER VACATING BLANKET AUTHORIZATION TO IMPORT NATURAL GAS FROM CANADA

DOE/FECM ORDER NO. 4808-A

May 26, 2023

On March 31, 2022, in DOE/FECM Order No. 4808, the Office of Fossil Energy and Carbon Management (FECM) of the Department of Energy (DOE) granted blanket authorization to Phillips 66 Company (Phillips 66) to import up to 14 billion cubic feet (Bcf) of natural gas from Canada by pipeline at any point on the border between the United States and Canada. This blanket authorization extends for a two-year term that began on May 1, 2022, and extends through April 30, 2024.

On April 14, 2023, Phillips 66 notified DOE that this authorization is no longer needed.¹ Phillips 66, therefore, requests that DOE vacate Order No. 4808, effective August 31, 2023.² DOE finds good cause to do so.

Accordingly, pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, Phillips 66's blanket authorization to import up to 14 Bcf of natural gas from Canada, granted in DOE/FECM Order No. 4808 on March 31, 2022, is hereby vacated, effective August 31, 2023.
