SST will obtain permits, design and construct an annex to the Training and Cascade Office Building (C-304) including site utilities, and associated access modifications. Construction will include a modular office structure connected to a site-built connector building, which in turn will connect to the existing C-304 building. This activity includes access, parking and utilities. The construction activity may require temporary removal of fencing, signs, and other minor obstructions along with infrastructure improvements to provide access for the large modular units and equipment.

No known extraordinary circumstances would be associated with these actions that might affect the significance or the environmental effects of the proposed action based on past similar actions. These actions would not be connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts or related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts; these actions meet the conditions that are integral elements of the classes of actions which have been categorically excluded from further National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documentation. To ensure that sensitive resources are protected, existing maps and surveys/studies of threatened and endangered species and their habitats, as well as wetlands and floodplains, have been reviewed. This work does not involve the removal of habitat or any other task that would have an adverse impact to environmentally sensitive resources at the Paducah Site.

The Construction of small-scale support buildings and support structures (prefabricated building) to house personnel for administrative purposes within or contiguous to previously developed areas has been categorically excluded as described in 451.1a-016 Revision 2, Alterations to Existing Buildings, Construction of Small-Scale Structures, and Relocation of Machinery, Equipment and Utilities. Excluded actions also include surface grading and leveling necessary for installation of the structures, construction of sidewalks and parking lots, excavation for installation of underground utilities and installation of aboveground utilities. Installation of water systems, electrical systems, communication and computer systems, security systems and installation of HVAC systems is covered by Categorical Exclusion 451.1a-014 Revision 2, Maintenance Activities.

Per 10 CFR 1021.410 (g)(2), factors considered when assessing whether the proposal is small, in addition to the actual magnitude of the proposal, include:

1. The relationship of the proposed action to similar types of development in the vicinity of the proposed action: the C-304 annex will be approximately the same size of and serve the same purpose as the C-304 building (as well as other buildings located in the immediate area such as C-302, C-100, etc.).

2. Expected outputs of emissions or waste - the use of the annex will not result in new waste streams or an increase in emissions to the environment.

The physical size of the proposed facility, the surrounding land uses, the scale of the proposed facility relative to existing development, and the capacity of existing roads and other infrastructure to support the proposed action were reviewed

A new checklist has been created to ensure no new compliance concerns, permits, etc. would be created during the performance of this activity.

Justifications:

- I. Construction of C-304 annex will impact Solid Waste Management Units (SWMU) 193 and 465 (SWMU Map, Figure skr100r28.mxd, dated 08-14-18). A SWMU notice is being processed through the Four Rivers Nuclear Partnership, LLC.
- No endangered or threatened species are found within the project area (US Fish and Wildlife Services document 04EK1000-2019-E-02224).
- No floodplains or floodways are located within the project area (FEMA National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette 21145C0105F and 21145C0110F).
- 4. No wetlands are located within the project area (National Wetlands Inventory, FY19 Rail Repairs Map, dated April 16, 2019).
- Construction of the C-304 annex is covered under Categorical Exclusion 451.1a-014 Revision 2, Maintenance Activities and Categorical Exclusion 451.1a-016 Revision 2, Alterations to Existing Buildings, Construction of Small-Scale Structures, and Relocation of Machinery, Equipment and Utilities.
- 6. Best Management Practices (e.g., controls for erosion, sedimentation, dust, etc.) will be in place during all activities associated with this project.
