Proposed Action Description:

AMENDED NEPA DETERMINATION: (See attached original Determination, dated July 15, 2020). This Amended Determination follows the approval of additional funds and extended project schedule to support the project team's small-scale, research and development activities for automated diagnostics of nuclear plant auxiliary systems, developed under the Generating Electricity Managed by Intelligent Nuclear Assets (GEMINA) Program. Specifically, the project team will expand their technology to apply to new systems that were not in use when the original project was developed. If successful, the technology would save operations and maintenance costs, in addition to reducing cost of nuclear energy generation.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities at Framatome, Inc. (Lynchburg, VA), Metroscope (Alexandria, VA), and Constellation (Washington, DC). Project tasks continue to fit within the class of actions identified under the DOE Categorical Exclusion identified below and do not involve any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the project. This assessment was based on a review of the proposed scope of work and the potential environmental impact of the project. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to the existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.

Proposed Action Description:

The GEMINA Program seeks to develop digital twin technology to reduce operations and maintenance (O&M) costs in the next generation of nuclear power plants by 10-times in order to make them more economical, flexible, and efficient. GEMINA teams will lower O&M costs by using diverse technologies such as artificial intelligence, advanced control systems, predictive maintenance, and model-based fault detection. The teams will also develop technologies that can facilitate integration into an electrical grid with a large fraction of intermittent generation resources. If successful, GEMINA teams will develop tools to introduce greater flexibility in reactor systems, increase autonomy in operations, and speed up design iteration, with a goal of reducing costs at advanced reactor power plants.

The GEMINA Program is composed of 9 small-scale research and development projects that will be conducted by universities, non-profit entities, for-profit entities, and federal laboratories. This Determination covers all of the 9 projects (listed in Attachment A). All 9 projects fit within the class of actions identified under the DOE Categorical Exclusion identified below and do not involve any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the projects. This assessment was based on a review of the proposed scope of work and the potential environmental impacts of each project. All project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and Local regulatory requirements.
