Dear Mrs. Sweeney:

On behalf of the Lake Charles Pilots Association, I am writing to express our unequivocal support for Lake Charles Exports, LLC's new application for long-term authorization to export LNG to non-Free Trade Agreement countries, and request for expedited consideration, from the existing Lake Charles Terminal. It is vital for the economic well-being of the Port of Lake Charles, Calcasieu Waterway, Calcasieu Parish, Cameron Parish, the state of Louisiana, and the country as a whole that the Department of Energy approve Lake Charles LNG Exports application as soon as possible.

This project will have a significant positive impact on job creation and economic output for the state of Louisiana over the multiple year construction period. It is my understanding that there will be nearly 3,000 estimated construction jobs during peak construction and billions of dollars of overall construction expenditures. And, once completed, the project will generate hundreds of high-quality jobs for the region related to LNG operations, tug operations and ancillary services. The export of LNG from the existing Lake Charles Terminal will provide a much-needed boost to Louisiana's local and regional economy through resource development, an enhanced tax base, direct and indirect job creation, and economic activity.

The Port of Lake Charles, Calcasieu Waterway, Calcasieu Parish, Cameron Parish, and the state of Louisiana will benefit greatly by the creation of these high paying jobs attributable to the Lake Charles LNG project. Although new jobs are first and foremost, it is vital that our community

be protected as well. Given that the Lake Charles LNG export facility will utilize significant existing infrastructure at the Lake Charles Terminal, environmental impacts from the construction of the export facility will be limited. I am heartened by the extensive environmental review already completed by the Department of Energy and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. These stewards of the environment have concluded that this project complies with applicable Federal environmental laws and that, taking into account the environmental conditions that Lake Charles LNG Exports has agreed to follow, this project will satisfy acceptable and prudent environmental standards.

I strongly encourage you to approve Lake Charles LNG Exports application as soon as possible in order to allow this long overdue project to proceed and benefit our community and all of Southwest Louisiana. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
