Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

# Rationale for determination:

The Department of Energy is proposing to provide funding to the Wisconsin State Energy Office for the installation of 100 kW of solar photovoltaic (PV) systems at the Forest Edge Apartments that are being developed by Cinnaire Solutions Corporation, (Cinnaire), a nonprofit community development financial organization, in Lac du Flambeau, WI. This project was originally one of two projects reviewed under GFO-0008669-022 but the Cinnarie project was later revised. This NEPA review replaces GFO-0008669-022, for the Cinnarie project only.

This revised project would include four rooftop PV arrays on multifamily residential buildings, yet to be constructed. Each of the four buildings would have 20 kW of PV. Each rooftop PV array would interconnect to that building's common area electrical service. The 5th site would be a ground mounted array, also 20 kWs, located next to the proposed Clubhouse Building. This ground mount array would be interconnected into the adjacent Clubhouse Building's electric service via a 30-foot conduit. The installation would require up to 10 poles to support the PV racking system and would be driven into the ground to a depth of no more than 10 feet.

Numerous trees will be removed, and significant ground disturbance will be required for the constructions of the multiple buildings. All tree removal, earth movement, and construction of the buildings would occur regardless of the PV installation.

The project site is outside of the 100-year floodplain.

The recipient is working directly with their State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) to ensure protection of cultural resources during the course of project activities, per their historic preservation programmatic agreement with DOE and the Wisconsin SHPO.

Any changes to the project activities or location are subject to additional NEPA review by DOE and are not authorized for federal funding unless and until the Contracting Officer provides written authorization on those additions or modifications.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
