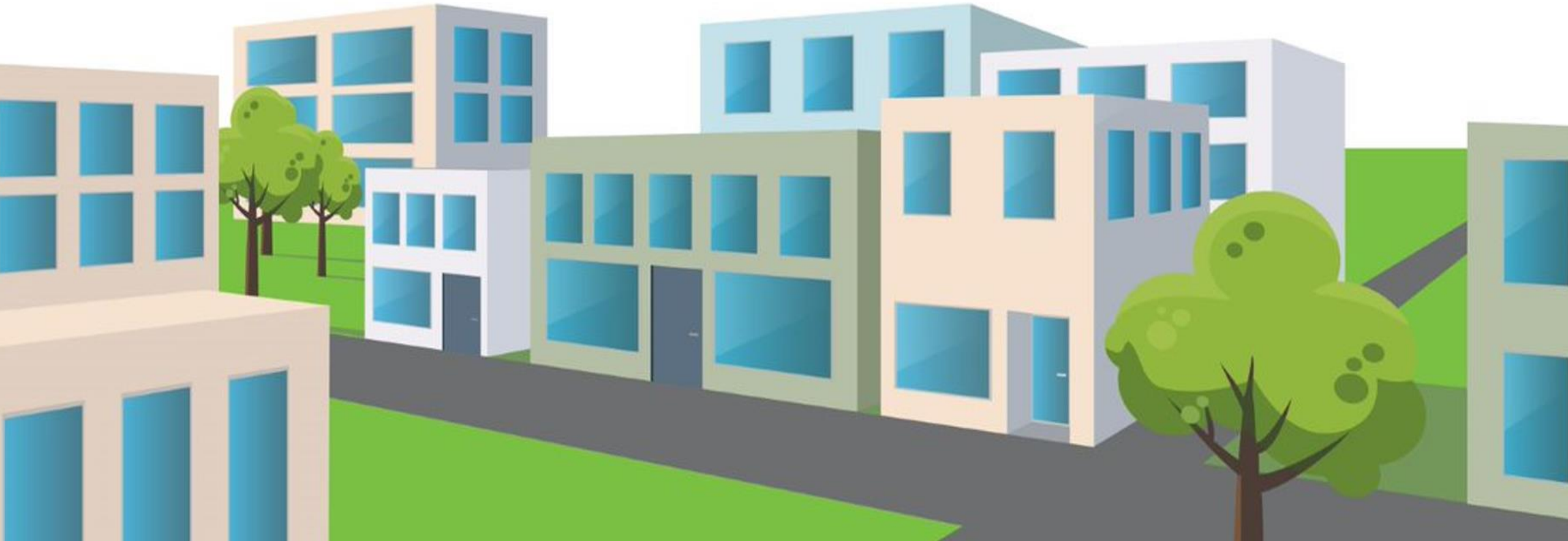

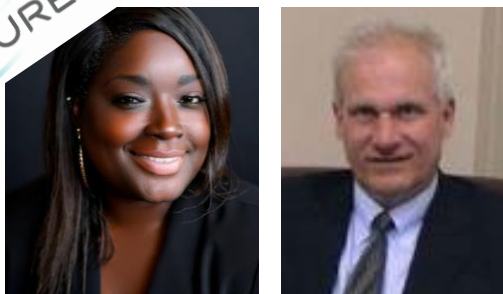

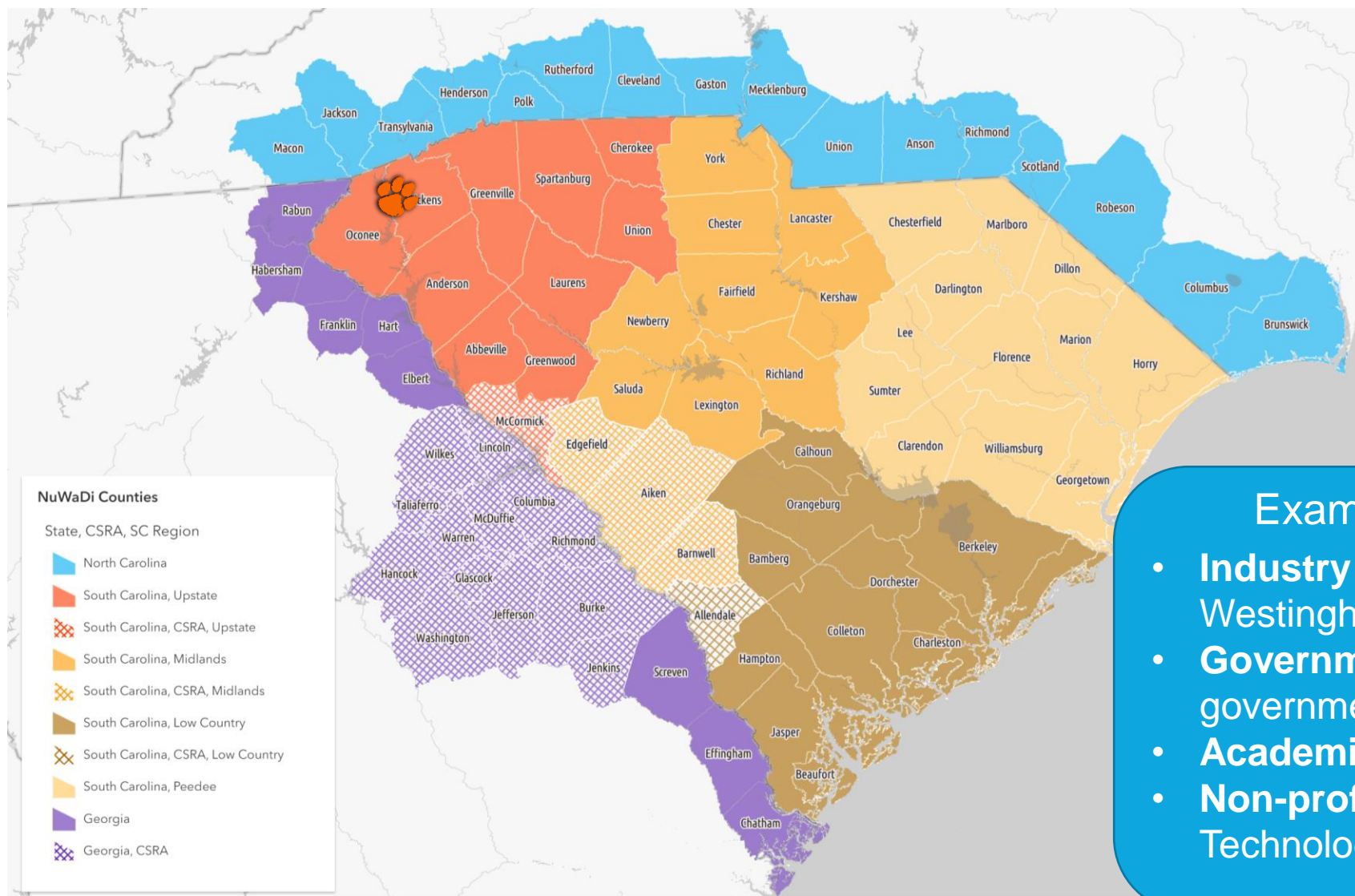

- **Non-profit** (e.g., Citizens for Nuclear Technology Awareness, places of worship)

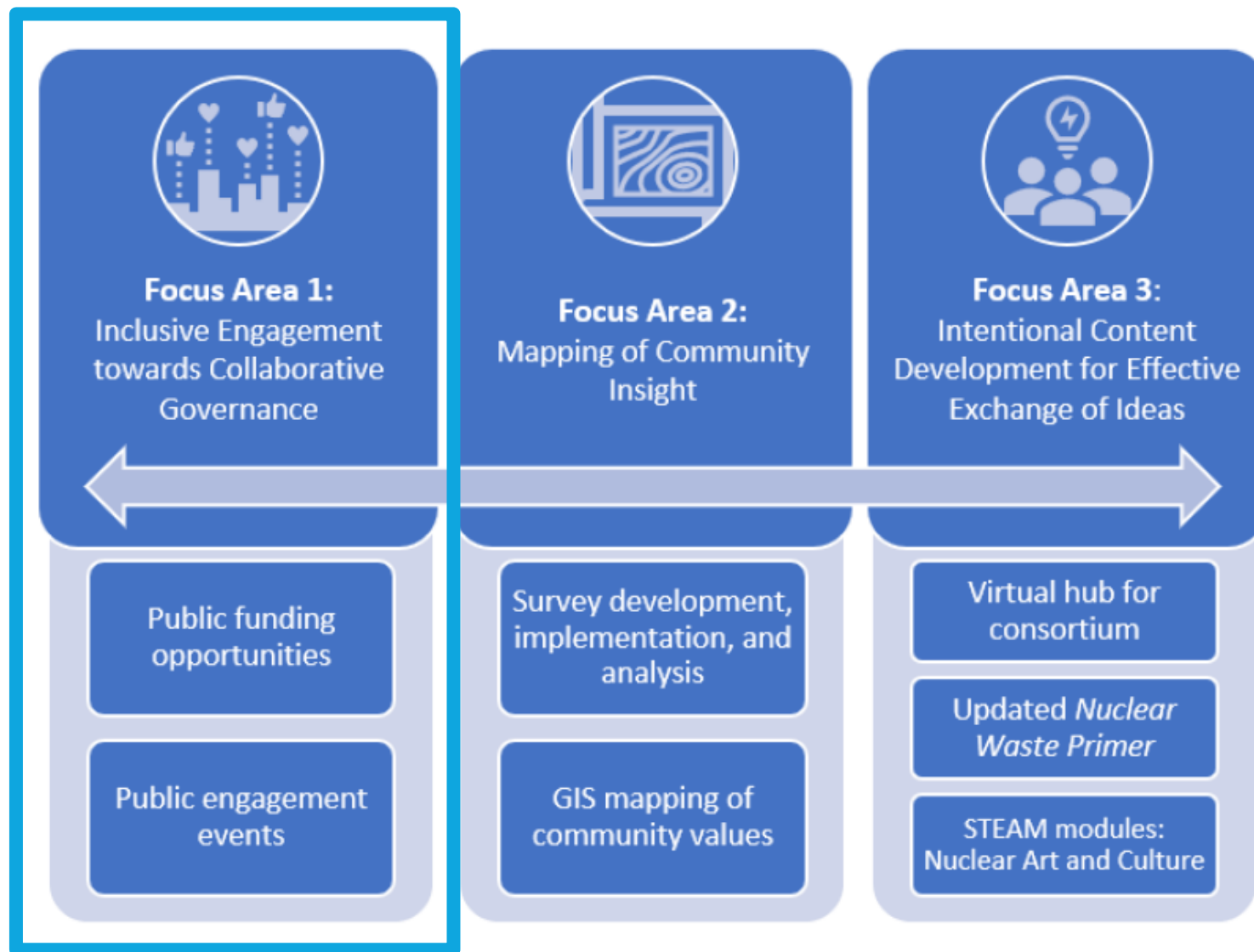
Overview of Process

Public funding opportunities

- Planning Grants
 - \$20,000 for 3-6 months
- Implementation Awards
 - \$100,000 for 12-18 months
- Community Action and Engagement Award
 - Up to \$10,000

Public engagement events

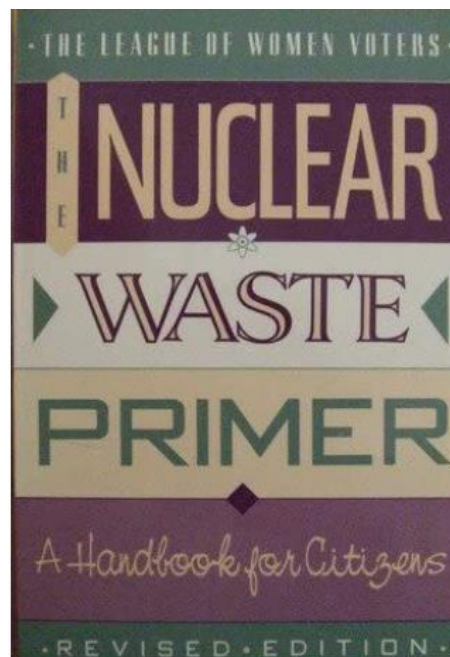
- Grant writing and knowledge sharing workshops
- Decision-making roundtables
- K-12 educator workshops



Outcomes Expected

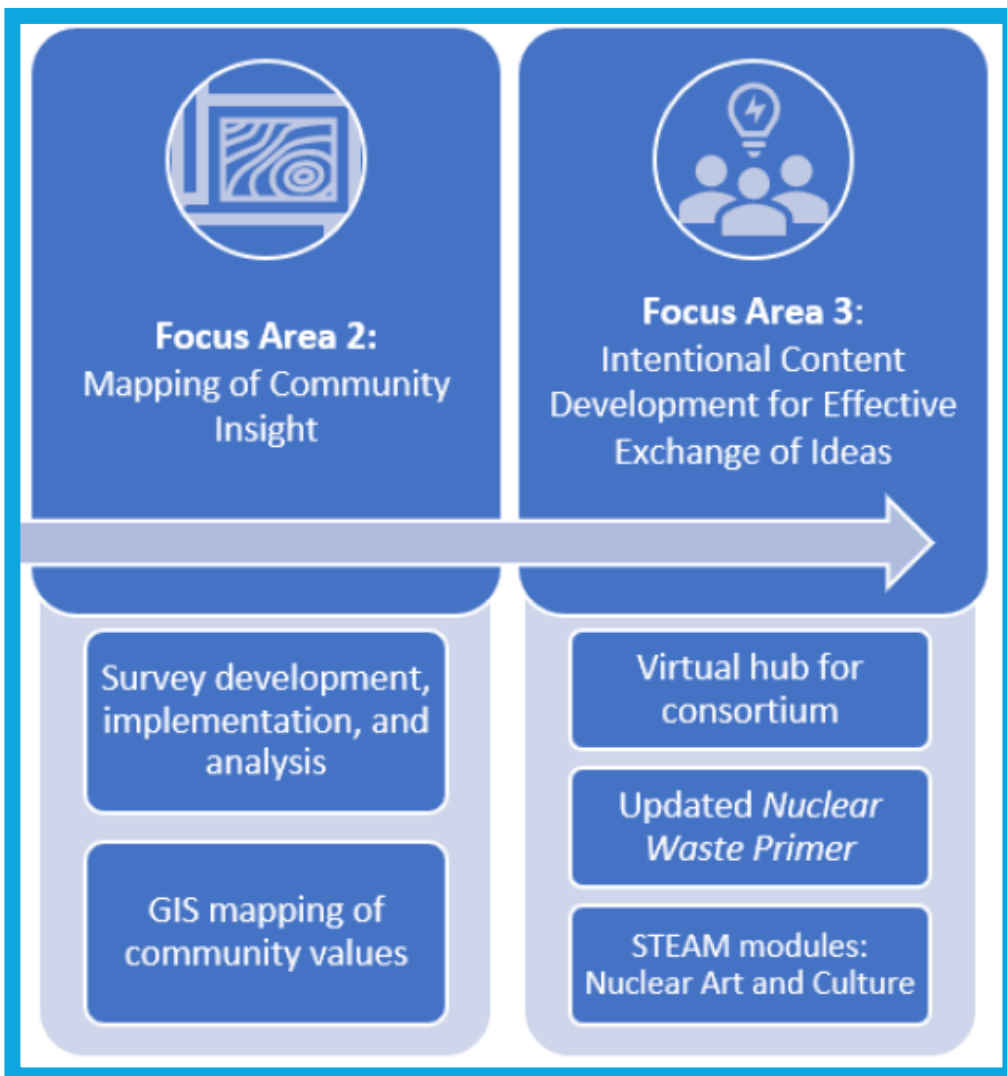
- Network of **engaged communities** across SC and the CSRA

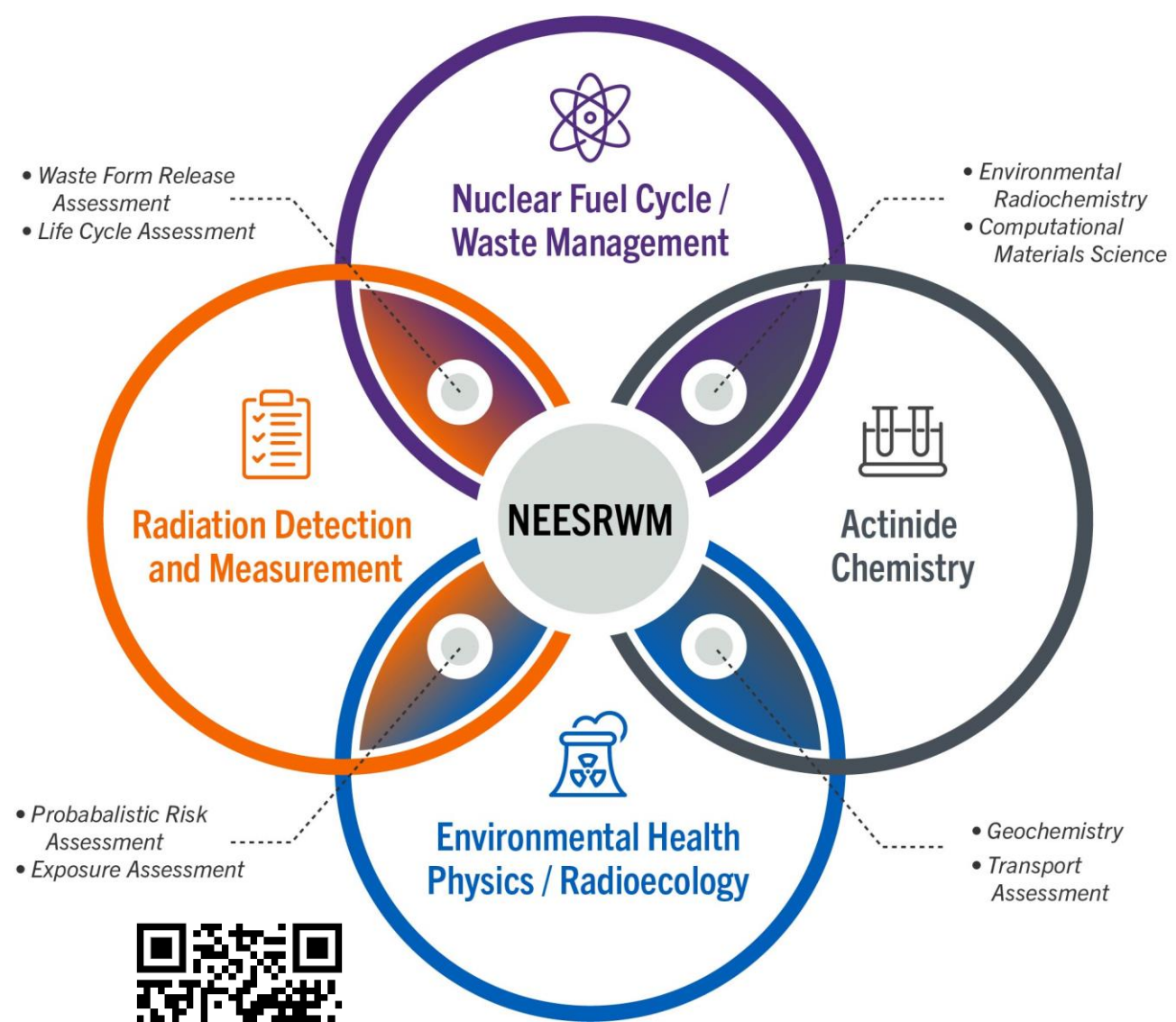
