# ► Where we live - Indian Island, Maine


The Penobscot Nation reservation, also known as Indian Island, is a three-mile-wide island situated in the Penobscot River.
There are app. 2,500 Penobscot tribal citizens with a fifth of those living on the reservation and ~ two-fifths living in the service area.


### **About**

- Penobscot Nation is building an 18,000 square foot building next to the Penobscot River, on the Penobscot reservation at Indian Island.
- The construction has begun and the walls are presently going up. The building will house tribal administration, the Penobscot Museum and the Tribal Court.




## From the outside, the building is like this:

### Solar - Our Vision



Increase solar in the commercial area of the island first, followed by residential.

Create nanogrids which we can connect into a microgrid.

Train Penobscot members in solar repair and maintenance (ongoing).

Apply for grants and renewable workforce development opportunities.

Start pre-engineering.

#### Results



- 1. Community Center Solar will be 94Kw from the DOE grant in Summer 2024
- 2. We will add 124 Kw of solar to the building in phase 2, along with battery storage and software to balance the batteries, generator and solar to make this a 24/7 operation.
- 3. When finished, this building will be the first nanogrid.
- 4. Several of these nanogrids together will make our microgrid.
- 5. A \$4.5 million grant from DOE has been awarded for our phase 2.
- 6. Pre-engineering work is underway.
