



### Native Village of Tyonek

- Dena'ina Athabascan village
- 43 miles southwest of Anchorage
- accessible by plane or boat
- Home to the Tebughna, or "Beach People"

# Native Village of Tyonek



- Tyonek is a closed and isolated community
- Airfare roundtrip from Anchorage
  - **\$280**
  - last year: \$260
  - o previous year: \$240
- There is no regular marine transportation in place.
- Gas per gallon:
  - o last year \$7.25,
  - year before \$5.25
- Wood last year \$150-\$200 per small pick-up truck load.
- Electricity comes from Chugach Electric, so same cost as "south" Anchorage, \$0.214/kWh

# Native Village of Tyonek

Population:

- 957 Tribal members
- 124 in Tyonek

The area encompassed by the Tribal village is 22.3 square miles of land and 3.3 square miles of water.

#### Temperatures:

- winter 4 to 22 °F
- summer 46 to 65 °F
- extremes -27 to 91 °F.

Average precipitation is 23 inches with 82 inches of snow.

Project: Energy efficiency improvements on two Tribal buildings

- Tyonek Tribal Center (lower left)
- Tyonek Native Corporation Satellite Office (red roof)

### Tyonek Tribal Center



The building is occupied

- from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm M F
- on weekends and during some evenings for community gatherings.

## Tyonek Native Corporation Satellite Office



The building is occupied

- 9:00 am to 4:00 pm M F
- The bedroom is used on occasion when guests are staying in the building.

# 2017 audits

Audits were completed in 2017 by staff from Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium.

Main recommended improvements from audits include

- replacing lights with LED lights
- installation of set-back thermostats
- maintenance of boilers and insulation of pipes
- air tightening
- addition of insulation

# Project objectives

- To reduce energy use in the rural village of Tyonek for better efficiency
- To reduce the impacts on climate change
- To keep the subsistence lifestyle
- To retrofit and update older buildings into current standards
- To better secure buildings for food security

# Project impacts

To reduce energy use of :

- the Satellite Office by 21%
- the Tribal Center by 18%

#### Projected annual energy savings:

- \$2,859 for the Satellite Office and
- \$2,500 for the Tribal Center.

Projected annual reduction in fuel oil #1

- 518 gallons for the Satellite Office and
- 280 gallons for the Tribal Center.

Projected annual reduction in electricity:

- 2,499 kWh for the Satellite Office and
- 7,310 kWh for the Tribal Center.

# Project status

#### Done:

- Current audit was done in February 2022
- Learned of another project which is improving the tribal center with ARPA funding
- Coordination started: some impacts to this project, including timeline
- The auditor also included a pre-feasibility study about partially replacing source of heat, baseboard, with air source heat pump for one wing
- NVT requested that change the rest of scope stayed very similar
- DOE approved it this summer

Send scope out for bids Evaluate bids, hire electrician Retrofit work Analyze savings Report

# Lessons learned
