Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Cocopah Indian Tribe to construct a solar photovoltaic (PV) system and underground conduit for electrical lines on the Cocopah East Indian Reservation in Somerton, Arizona.

The PV and associated distribution equipment would be installed on an undisturbed parcel of land south of the casino and RV park on the Cocopah East Reservation, with a footprint of approximately 12 to 13 acres. The PV system would be installed on horizonal single-axis trackers (HSAT). The array would be interconnected to the service distribution equipment. Systems components include underground and overhead raceways and conductors, pad-mounted and pole-mounted electrical equipment, and enclosures. Foundations for HSAT would be driven piers with PV arrays mounted to the racking, 4 to 6 feet above grade. All activities would occur on undeveloped areas on the Cocopah Reservation. There are no known historic properties or districts within the vicinity of the proposed project. The Arizona State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) was consulted and the SHPO concurred with a finding of no historic properties affected.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website identifies one threatened species (Yellow-billed Cuckoo) one endangered species (Yuma Ridgway's Rail), and one candidate species (Monarch Butterfly), which may occur in the proposed project area. No critical habitats are identified within the proposed project area.

Yellow-billed Cuckoo use wooded habitat, with dense cover and water nearby, which is not present in the project area. Yuma Ridgway's Rail inhibit freshwater marshes. No aquatic habitats would be impacted by this project; therefore, these species would not be impacted by the proposed action. DOE has determined no effect to special status species.

Minimal air emissions may result from the use of vehicles and equipment during construction of the system. However, significant air impacts are not anticipated as emissions would be temporary and intermittent.

Project activities would involve hazards associated with working with electricity. Any risks working with hazards would be mitigated through established safety and construction protocols. The Cocopah Indian Tribe would observe all applicable health, safety, and environmental regulations. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

DOE has considered the scale, duration, and nature of the proposed activities to determine potential impacts on

sensitive resources, including those of an ecological, historical, cultural, and socioeconomic nature, and found no effects that would be expected to result from the proposed project activities.

This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
