

## National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Determination Categorical Exclusion

Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION APPENDIX, NUMBER, AND DESCRIPTION: A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination: Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. (See also B3.1 of appendix B to this subpart.)

Rationale for Determination: OCED is proposing to provide funding to Heidelberg Materials US, Inc. in support of the Mitchell Cement Integrated CO2 Capture Project. The project would expand upon work being completed under FECM FOA-2515 (DE-FE0032222) and FECM FOA-2610 (DE-FE0032268). The scope of this project would include project management, community benefits work, a CO2 capture front-end engineering design (FEED) study, CO2 transport FEED study, a storage field development plan to permanently sequester the captured CO2 onsite, and permit application preparation. FEED studies would be designed for the Mitchell Cement Plant in Mitchell, Indiana; however, that location is subject to change. Site characterization studies would consist of analyzing existing data that would be used to inform the engineering design. No construction or fieldwork would be completed.

⊠The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. - (5) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements, such as those listed in paragraph B (5) of 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B.
