Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy has provided funds to the Wisconsin Public Service Commission which is proposing to fund a 128kW rooftop photovoltaic (PV) system with a 225 kWh Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) at the Sun Prairie Public Library located at 1350 Linnerud Dr. in Sun Prairie, WI. The library has approved plans to expand the facility independent of the DOE funding, where the proposed PV and BESS would be installed. The library expansion is an independent effort and would be completed regardless of the DOE funded activities.

The proposed DOE project activities would include the design, installation, and testing associated with integrating the PV system and BESS into a utility grid interactive microgrid. The PV system would require 284 modules and two inverters with optimizers. The 12 feet long, 8 feet wide, 8 feet high BESS unit would require a concrete pad adjacent to the northeast corner of the building. Microgrid components located within the new library expansion would include a utility monitor, automated breaker, electrical panel with additional circuitry, microgrid controller, and a BESS controller. The existing transformer would require upgrading by Sun Prairie Utilities Energy power company.

The project site is outside of the 100-year floodplain.

The recipient is working directly with their State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) to ensure protection of cultural resources during the course of project activities, per their historic preservation programmatic agreement with DOE and the Wisconsin SHPO.

Installation of the proposed project may involve the use of heavy equipment and working with electricity. Potential hazards would be mitigated through adherence to established institutional health and safety policies and procedures. The sub-recipient and their partners would adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local health, safety, and environmental regulations. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

Any changes to the project activities or locations are subject to additional NEPA review by DOE and are not authorized for federal funding unless and until the Contracting Officer provides written authorization on those additions or modifications.
