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Key Developments

- Hosted narrative workshop to develop stories and complementary essays about consent-based siting
- Revised community dialogue activities
- Held 12 community dialogues across Arizona
 - 3 with high school groups
 - 6 at libraries
 - 1 with the Arizona Faith Network
 - 2 longer dialogues hosted by ASU
- Re-evaluating approach for engaging tribal communities
- Continued project formative evaluation focused on documenting our processes and relationships with project partners.











Key Observations



- Community dialogues
 - Consistent gov concerns in discussing local challenges and when discussing a spent fuel facility: Trusted sources of information, transparency, accountability, need to work across sectors/communities.
 - High School groups, even when provided very little background, are very attune to challenges of building a spent fuel facility: How are surrounding communities to be involved? How long will the facility be open?
 - Consistent community concerns: Housing and homelessness, safety and drug use, access to essential services
- Challenges with facilitation: Not all partners have capacity to facilitate conversations but are still willing to host dialogues.
- Feedback from potential tribal partners:
 - This is not an easy thing to take to their networks.
 - Concern this is a government-to-government issue, not a research/university-to-tribal government conversation.



Engagement – Community Dialogues


Purpose: Explore perspectives of Arizonans on what it means to make community decisions about 1) a local challenge and 2) siting a spent fuel storage facility

Format: Facilitated discussion w/ 5-12 people recruited via partners and platforms like craigslist. Compensated with gift cards (\$100 for 5 hours)

Agenda:

- What challenges does you community face?
- Who should be involved and how in making decisions about those challenges?
- Intro to nuclear energy and waste
- Who should be involved and how in making decisions about a spent fuel facility?

 - Identify salient questions, challenges, and issues to place before communities in larger-scale forums.
