Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

B3.1 Site characterization and environmental monitoring Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. (See also B3.1 of appendix B to this subpart.)

Site characterization and environmental monitoring (including, but not limited to, siting, construction, modification, operation, and dismantlement and removal or otherwise proper closure (such as of a well) of characterization and monitoring devices, and siting, construction, and associated operation of a smallscale laboratory building or renovation of a room in an existing building for sample analysis). Such activities would be designed in conformance with applicable requirements and use best management practices to limit the potential effects of any resultant ground disturbance. Covered activities include, but are not limited to, site characterization and environmental monitoring under CERCLA and RCRA. (This class of actions excludes activities in aquatic environments. See B3.16 of this appendix for such activities.) Specific activities include, but are not limited to: (a) Geological, geophysical (such as gravity, magnetic, electrical, seismic, radar, and temperature gradient), geochemical, and engineering surveys and mapping, and the establishment of survey marks. Seismic techniques would not include large-scale reflection or refraction testing; (b) Installation and operation of field instruments (such as stream-gauging stations or flow-measuring devices, telemetry systems, geochemical monitoring tools, and geophysical exploration tools); (c) Drilling of wells for sampling or monitoring of groundwater or the vadose (unsaturated) zone, well logging, and installation of water-level recording devices in wells; (d) Aquifer and underground reservoir response testing; (e) Installation and operation of ambient air monitoring equipment; (f) Sampling and characterization of water, soil, rock, or contaminants (such as drilling using truck- or mobile-scale equipment, and modification, use, and plugging of boreholes); (g) Sampling and characterization of water effluents, air emissions, or solid waste streams; (h) Installation and operation of meteorological towers and associated activities (such as assessment of potential wind energy resources); (i) Sampling of flora or fauna; and (j) Archeological, historic, and cultural resource identification in compliance with 36 CFR part 800 and 43 CFR part 7.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the Metlakatla Indian Community to design, procure, and construct a 1.5-megawatt wind turbine on Annette Islands Reserve outside the town of Metlakatla, Alaska.

This NEPA Determination (ND) only applies to activities identified in Task 0, Task 1 (subtask 1.1, 1.3, and 1.4), Task 2 (subtask 2.1, 2.2, 2.6, and 2.7), Task 3 (subtask 3.1 through 3.3), Task 4 (Subtask 4.1 through 4.5), Task 5, Task 6 (subtask 6.1 and 6.2), and Task 7 (subtask 7.1 and 7.2). It does not apply to any other tasks or activities. All other tasks and activities are dependent on the outcome of the tasks and subtasks reviewed in this ND and would require additional NEPA review.

Task 0, Task 1 (subtask 1.1, 1.3, and 1.4), Task 2 (subtask 2.1, 2.2, 2.6, and 2.7), Task 3 (subtask 3.1 through 3.3), Task 4 (Subtask 4.1 through 4.5), Task 5, Task 6 (subtask 6.1 and 6.2), and Task 7 (subtask 7.1 and 7.2) include administrative, desktop, and field survey activities such as, project management, stakeholder engagement, data collection, biological and cultural surveys, monitoring, and research, geotechnical surveys, and consultations with agencies and stakeholders.

DOE would require the following as part of best management practices for the project: If during project activities the

recipient or their contractors encounter any cultural materials (i.e. historic or prehistoric), all activities must cease in the vicinity of the discovery immediately. The recipient must inform the Tribal Historic Preservation Office (THPO), State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), and DOE Project Officer of the discovery so that an evaluation of the discovery can be completed prior to continuing work.

Minimal air emissions may result from the use of vehicles and geotechnical equipment during field surveys. However, significant air impacts are not anticipated as emissions would be temporary and intermittent. Hazards associated with geotechnical and field surveys include use of machinery and large equipment, exposure to weather, and traversing unlevel ground. Employee training, proper protective equipment, and internal safety reviews and assessments would be utilized to mitigate hazards. Existing Tribal and corporate health, safety, and environmental policies and procedures would be followed for all tasks. The Tribe would observe all applicable health, safety, and environmental regulations. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

NEPA PROVISION

DOE has made a conditional NEPA determination.

Task 1 (subtask 1.2 and 1.5), Task 2 (subtask 2.3 through 2.5, and 2.8), Task 3 (subtask 3.4), Task 7 (subtask 7.3 through 7.6), Task 8 (all subtasks), Task 9 (all subtasks), and Task 10 (all subtasks)

Include the following condition in the financial assistance agreement:

If during project activities the recipient or their contractors encounter any cultural materials (i.e. historic or prehistoric), all activities must cease in the vicinity of the discovery immediately. The Recipient must inform the Tribal Historic Preservation Office (THPO), State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) and DOE Project Officer of the discovery so that an evaluation of the discovery can be completed prior to continuing work.

FOR CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATIONS
