Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:	
B2.1 Workplace enhancements	Modifications within or contiguous to an existing structure, in a previously disturbed or developed area, to enhance workplace habitability (including, but not limited to, installation or improvements to lighting, radiation shielding, or heating/ventilating/air conditioning and its instrumentation, and noise reduction).
B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems	The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the U.S. Department of State (State) to switch all U.S. government occupied residences in South Africa to solar photovoltaic-generated electricity and battery storage (BES). These activities would lessen the U.S. government's impact on local power grids.

Activities would include PV solar array installation on 25 residences in Pretoria, Johannesburg, Cape Town, and Durban, South Africa. Specific PV system designs would depend on the type of residence. Standard staff residences would have 36 PV panels with three powerwalls; representational residences would have larger contained battery systems with 120 PV panels; and residences that also serve as Alternate Command Centers would have 40 panels and six powerwalls. Installation would be overseen by the Mission South Africa facility management and general services team.

Because State is a federal agency, it is required to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) for this project. This would include completing an environmental review for the project, including any necessary consultations and geotechnical or other surveys prior to a decision whether to proceed. If State proceeds with the proposed project after their NEPA review, they would be required to obtain all necessary permits and follow appropriate environmental, health, and safety measures. State must provide its final NEPA determination(s) to their DOE Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP) Technical Project Officer (TPO) or point of contact.

DOE has made a final NEPA determination.

The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. DOE has determined that work to be carried out outside of the United States, its territories and possessions is exempt from further review pursuant to Section 5.1.1 of the DOE Final Guidelines for Implementation of Executive Order 12114; "Environmental Effects Abroad of Major Federal Actions."

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
