Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

### Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the State of Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) to design and install solar rooftop systems on Fresh Solutions' facility at 70255 Blue School Road, White Pigeon, Michigan.

Activities would include the design and installation of two separate rooftop solar systems on Fresh Solutions' existing potato packing and storage facility built in 2008. One system would consist of 996 panels for a 398 kilo-watt (kW) solar system to provide solar energy to the potato packing facility. The second system would consist of 410 solar panels for a 164 kW solar system to provide solar power to the onsite potato storage. Both systems would be installed on the same rooftop. Facility modifications would not be required. There would be no ground disturbance as a result of this award.

Minimal air emissions may result from the use of diesel-powered vehicles and equipment during installation of rooftop solar panel systems. However, significant air impacts are not anticipated as emissions would be temporary and intermittent. Award activities would involve typical hazards associated with rooftop solar panel installation, including working on an elevated and inclined surface (roof) and working with electricity. Existing health, safety, and environmental policies and procedures would be followed to mitigate hazards to acceptable levels. Skilled tradespeople would work on the project and all industry-standard health and safety policies and procedures including employee training and the use of proper PPE would be followed. Fresh Solutions, LLC would observe all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, and would obtain and comply with all necessary permits and authorizations.

The recipient would work directly with their State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) to ensure protection of cultural resources during the course of project activities, per their historic preservation programmatic agreement with DOE and the Michigan SHPO.

DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
