Proposed Action Description:

The BREAKERS Program seeks to fund the development of novel technologies for medium voltage direct current (MVDC) circuit breakers, applicable to markets including electrified transportation, MVDC grid distribution, renewable interconnections, and offshore oil, gas, and wind production. If successful, innovations in MVDC circuit breakers developed in the BREAKERS Program could enable significant efficiency improvements in the United States; transforming how electricity is delivered and managed across the entire power grid, in transportation, and other valuable parts of the economy.

The BREAKERS Program is composed of 8 small-scale research and development projects that will be conducted by universities, non-profit entities, for-profit entities, and federal laboratories. Five (5) (listed in Attachment A) of the eight (8) BREAKERS projects are covered by this Determination and fit within the class of actions identified under the DOE Categorical Exclusions identified below and do not involve any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the projects. This assessment was based on a review of the proposed scope of work and the potential environmental impacts of each project. Project tasks for these 5 projects under the BREAKERS Program will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and Local regulatory requirements.

<u>Proposed Action Title</u>: Enegis, LLC -- Ambient Seismic Imaging Technology for Low Cost and Effective Geothermal Resource Exploration, Development, and Management

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's small-scale research and development to apply Ambient Seismic Imaging (ASI) to image permeability pathways and fluid flow in rock to advance geothermal resource development. Specifically, the project team will (1) characterize and optimize the ASI signals, (2) determine optimal sensors and develop initial velocity model, and (3) acquire seismic images. If successful, this project will enable the use of ASI to lower costs, reduce risk, and increase accuracy for characterizing permeability features and fluid flow for geothermal resource development, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions from energy production.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities at Enegis, LLC (Fairfax, VA), Ambient Reservoir Monitoring Inc. (Houston, TX), and Newberry geothermal field (Deschutes County, OR [Lat: Lat. 43.715214, Long. -121.318260]) designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. Enegis has not obtained all necessary permits and approvals for the activities planned following their Go/No Go Milestone for ASI testing on federal land in the Newberry geothermal field. The project team is prohibited from commencing field testing until (1) obtaining the necessary permits and approvals and (2) providing written assurances to ARPA-E of the same.
