Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

CX, EA, EIS APPENDIX AND NUMBER:

Description:

B1.32 Traffic flow adjustments flow adjustments including but not limited to, stop sign or traffic light installation, adjusting direction of traffic flow, and adding turning lanes), and road adjustments (including, but not limited to, widening and realignment) that are within an existing right-of-way and consistent with approved land use or transportation improvement plans.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the city of Beaumont in Jefferson County, Texas to remove and replace lane markings on Magnolia Avenue in Beaumont, Texas. This project would be funded under the Administrative and Legal Requirements Document (ALRD) for the DOE's Energy Efficiency Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Program Formula Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (EECBG Formula - IIJA).

Award activities would involve the removal of existing pavement markings and remarking a new lane pattern that would include bike lanes, narrower vehicle travel lanes, and a two-way left turn lane in the middle. The project would run along Magnolia Avenue from East Lucas Drive to Laurel Avenue, for approximately three miles. There would be no new pavement, no ground disturbance, and no trees would be trimmed or removed.

The City of Beaumont would adhere to the terms and restrictions of the DOE executed Historic Preservation Programmatic Agreement with the State of Texas, available at https://www.energy.gov/node/812599.

Minimal air emissions may result from vehicles and equipment that would be used to remove and install the pavement markings, but emissions would be temporary and intermittent. Existing government and corporate health, safety, and environmental policies and procedures would be followed, including personnel training, proper personal protective equipment (PPE), monitoring, and internal assessments. The City of Beaumont would observe all applicable federal, state, and local health, safety, and environmental regulations and requirements. DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed activities of the project.

NEPA PROVISION

DOE has made a final NEPA determination.
