Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy is proposing to provide funding to the Wisconsin Office of Energy Innovation to install an approximate 64kW rooftop solar photovoltaic (PV) system with a 40kWH battery storage system and cold weather air sourced heat pumps (CWHP) at the Hillcrest Manor located at 406 Park Street in Ontario, WI. The 12-unit apartment complex provides housing to low-income seniors and persons with disabilities as well as a community meeting place during emergency events.

Project activities include the installation of mounting, racking, inverters, and meters for the PV system, as well as new electrical wiring. The battery storage system would be located in the interior meter room and would require electrical modifications for the connections, but no structural modifications would be necessary. The existing wall unit air conditioners would be removed and necessitate the existing openings be framed, insulated, and sealed closed. Thirteen CWHPs would be installed on exterior walls for each apartment and the common area with new wiring and piping through the walls. The only possible ground disturbance would be the placement of the 3'x3' plastic pads on the ground adjacent to the building to support the CWHPs.

DOE has considered potential impacts on resources of concern, including those of a historical, cultural, and socioeconomic nature, and does not anticipate impacts on these resources.

The recipient is working directly with their State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) to ensure protection of cultural resources during the course of project activities, per their historic preservation programmatic agreement with DOE and the Wisconsin SHPO.

Any changes to the project activities or locations are subject to additional NEPA review by DOE and are not authorized for federal funding unless and until the Contracting Officer provides written authorization on those additions or modifications.
