Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. (See also B3.1 of appendix B to this subpart.)

## Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to administer Congressionally Directed Spending to Alaska Longline Fisherman's Association (ALFA) for the development of a decarbonization plan for the fishing fleet in Southeast Alaska.

The proposed award activities would occur over two years. Project activities would consist of planning, design, research, project coordination, management and evaluation. This project would bring experts from the Alaska commercial fishing industry who would have experience in reducing greenhouse gas emissions from the harvesting, processing, and sale of seafood. A decarbonization plan would also be developed for Southeast Alaska. This plan would include, performing energy audits, identifying immediate implementation strategies, and creating clear pathways to next-generation fuels, along with the infrastructure to support adoption, and the funding opportunities to facilitate uptake. All project activities would be conducted at the ALFA Office Building, Sitka, AK.

All project activities would be completed in existing, purpose-built facilities. Existing corporate health and safety policies and procedures would be followed including employee training, proper protective equipment, engineering controls, and monitoring. Additional policies and procedures would be implemented as necessary if new health and safety risks are identified. The project would not generate toxic waste, and any unforeseen toxic waste would be disposed of in accordance with all local, state and federal regulations.

DOE has considered the scale, duration, and nature of proposed activities to determine potential impacts on resources, including those of an ecological, historical, cultural, and socioeconomic nature. DOE does not anticipate impacts on these resources which would be considered significant or require DOE to consult with other agencies or stakeholders.
