Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

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A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination	Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to administer Congressionally Directed Spending to City of Anaheim for sustainability-themed workshops and events, STEM education, hands-on energy and water efficiency demonstrations, new technology displays, and career path exploration at the Anaheim Sustainability Education Center which provides regional, educational, and workforce development resources to the local community.

The proposed award activities would include outfitting the facility with multimedia display equipment to enhance the workforce and education elements. Hands-on educational kits and pertinent supplies would be purchased to demonstrate energy and water efficiency augmentation within a classroom setting. All project activities would be conducted at the Sustainability Education Center facility in Anaheim, CA.

All project activities would be completed in existing, purpose-built facilities. No construction or building modifications would take place. Existing corporate health and safety policies and procedures would be followed including employee training, proper protective equipment, engineering controls, and monitoring. Additional policies and procedures would be implemented as necessary if new health and safety risks are identified. The project would not generate toxic waste, and any unforeseen toxic waste would be disposed of in accordance with all local, state and federal regulations.

DOE has considered the scale, duration, and nature of proposed activities to determine potential impacts on resources, including those of an ecological, historical, cultural, and socioeconomic nature. DOE does not anticipate impacts on these resources which would be considered significant or require DOE to consult with other agencies or stakeholders.
