Pursuant to 10 C.F.R 590.303, Breathe Easy Susquehanna County (BESC) herein files this motion to intervene in the above-captioned document. In opposition we state as follows:

We represent an impacted upstream community: Susquehanna County PA. Both the Constitution and NED Pipelines originate in our community. Natural gas extracted literally from under our homes schools backyards and frontyards will feed into the Constitution and the NED. Both these transmission lines are identified by Pieridae as potential sources of transportatino capacity to serve this project.

Exports will induce more domestic production, more extraction, processing and production in our community. Both FERC and DOE must include the environmental UPSTREAM impacts to our air water health etc in their review of export products. The cumulative air impacts and subsequent public health risks in our community are not well defined studied or understood from natural gas extraction and production.

DOE has understated natural gas production's methane leak rate, and thus the climate impact of LNG exports. LNG is not a climate solution and exports are inconsistent with the Obama administration's climate goals and international commitments.

LNG exports are inconsistent with our community's interest as natural gas extraction processing and production impacts to our air have not been transparently or independently studied and researched and as such are not well characterized. The subsequent risks to our public health are not well defined or understood. LNG exports are generally inconsistent with public interest.
