ORDER GRANTING BLANKET AUTHORIZATION TO EXPORT LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS TO CANADA BY TRUCK

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 3589

FEBRUARY 4, 2015

I. DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

On December 4, 2014, ENN Canada Corporation (ENN) filed an application with the Office of Fossil Energy (FE) of the Department of Energy (DOE) under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (NGA)¹ for blanket authorization to export liquefied natural gas (LNG) to Canada by truck, in a volume up to the equivalent of 2 billion cubic feet (Bcf) of natural gas. The applicant requests the authorization be granted for a two-year term beginning on February 22, 2015.² ENN is a Canadian corporation with its principal place of business in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada.

II. FINDING

The application has been evaluated to determine if the proposed import and/or export arrangement meets the public interest requirement of section 3 of the NGA, as amended by section 201 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Pub. L. 102-486). Under section 3(c), the import and export of natural gas, including LNG, from and to a nation with which there is in effect a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas and the import of LNG from other international sources are deemed to be consistent with the public interest, and applications for such imports or exports must be granted without modification or delay. The authorization sought by ENN to export LNG to Canada, a nation with which a free trade agreement is in effect, meets the section 3(c) criterion and, therefore, is consistent with the public interest. This Order authorizes transactions with terms of no longer than two years.

² ENN's blanket authorization to export LNG to Canada by truck, granted in DOE/FE Order No. 3216 on January 2, 2013, extends through February 21, 2015.

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the NGA, it is ordered that:

A. ENN is authorized to export LNG to Canada by truck, a volume up to the equivalent of 2 Bcf of natural gas, pursuant to transactions that have terms of no longer than two years.

This authorization shall be effective for a two-year term beginning on February 22, 2015, and extending through February 21, 2017.

B. This LNG may be exported by truck from any LNG loading facility in the United States and its territories.

C. **Monthly Reports:** With respect to the exports of LNG authorized by this Order, ENN shall file with the Office of Oil and Gas Global Security and Supply, within 30 days following the last day of each calendar month, a report indicating whether imports and/or exports of LNG have been made. Monthly reports shall be filed whether or not initial deliveries have begun. If exports have not occurred, a report of "no activity" for that month must be filed.

If exports of LNG by truck have occurred, the report must give the following details of each LNG cargo: (1) the name of the U.S. departure facility; (2) the country of destination; (3) the point(s) of exit; (4) the name(s) of the supplier(s)/seller(s); (5) the name(s) of the LNG transporter(s); (6) the volume in Mcf; (7) the delivered price per MMBtu at the point of exit; and (8) the duration of the supply agreement.

D. The first monthly report required by this Order is due not later than March 30, 2015, and should cover the reporting period from February 22, 2015, through February 28, 2015.
