Dear Mr. Anderson:

On December 31, 2014, American LNG Marketing LLC (“American LNG”) filed an application (“Application”) with the Department of Energy Office of Fossil Energy (“DOE/FE”) requesting long-term multi-contract authorization to export domestically produced liquefied natural gas (“LNG”) from a natural gas liquefaction project under construction on the northern portion of the Hialeah Rail Yard near Medley, Florida (“Hialeah Facility”). On March 18, 2015, American LNG received Order 3601 Granting Long-term, Multi-contract Authorization to Export LNG to Free Trade Agreement Nations (“FTA Authorization”). American LNG’s request for authorization from DOE/FE to export LNG to any country with which the United States does not have a free trade agreement requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas and with which trade is not prohibited by U.S. law or policy is pending in Docket No. 14-209-LNG (“NFTA Authorization”).

American LNG is submitting this letter to clarify the location of the Hialeah Facility. The Hialeah Facility’s mailing address is 6800 NW 72nd Street, Medley, Florida. The location of the Hialeah Facility is further described in Appendix C and Appendix D (including latitude and longitude) of the Application. The Hialeah Facility is physically located in an unincorporated portion of Miami-Dade County about 500 ft (as measured in Google Earth) from the City of Medley boundary line. The text of the Application stated that the Hialeah Facility is in Medley, Florida. This clarification does not affect any aspect of the permitting, construction or operation of the Hialeah Facility.
