Renewable Energy Development: Partnerships

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Partnership Development

- NTUA has worked with various entities to develop partnership opportunities
 - Seek Out Municipal Utilities, Cooperatives, Investor Owned Utilities and Developers
 - Kayenta Solar Project NTUA has sold displaced energy and renewable energy credits to Salt River Project
 - NTUA Wireless NTUA entered into project development agreement with Commnet, wherein NTUA maintains 51% ownership for a last mile wireless communications services
- NTUA has taken on a leadership role in developing renewable energy projects within the Navajo Nation
 - To address some job and economic losses from reduction of the Navajo Nation's coal economy
 - Promotes skills enhancement and renewable workforce development



Projected Impact From NGS Partial Closure

- ❖ Navajo Generating Station
 - **❖ 2250 MW coal-fired plant, located in the Navajo Nation**
 - **❖** Over 70% the employees are Navajo
 - **❖** Looking at approximately 750MW of closed production by 2020
 - At approximately 100 Navajo employees at the plant projected to lose their jobs
 - **❖** Navajo Nation projected to lose \$4.75M in revenue annually
 - **❖** Could result in the furlough of 50 NN government employees
 - **❖** Kayenta Mine supporting the plant will experience at least a 30% reduction in jobs, which is approximately 80 employees.
 - ❖ Projected energy use reduction by Kayenta Mine would result in a 33% increase in NTUA's residential customer electric rates
 - ❖ 230 JOBS WOULD BE LOST!



CUMULATIVE NEGATIVE ECONOMIC IMPACT

- **❖** Average per capita income is \$10,695, compared to the U.S. average per capita income of \$27,915.
- **❖** 38% of the population live below the poverty line.
- **❖** Unemployment has remained at 52% since 2005.
- **❖ THE PROJECTED NEGATIVE IMPACT TO THE NAVAJO ECONOMY:**
 - **❖ AT LEAST 950 LOST JOBS**
 - **❖** Unemployment rate will increase above 52%
 - → +\$24M OF ANNUAL REVENUE LOSSES TO THE NAVAJO NATION FROM LOSS OF COAL MINE ROYALTIES
 - **❖ NTUA CONSUMER ELECTRICITY RATES PROJECTED TO INCREASE BY NEARLY 10%**



RENEWABLE ENERGY - VALUE PROPOSITION

- Seeking to mitigate negative economic impacts from reduced capacity of coal-fired generation facilities
- Seeking to strengthen and diversify Navajo economy
- Seeking to address wide-ranging Economic Benefits to the Navajo Nation, the Local Community, the Navajo People, and NTUA
 - NTUA seeks to create some green jobs for Navajo residents
 - Seeking to create Navajo Nation tax revenue
 - Would provide local Chapter tax revenue
 - NTUA seeks to maintain lower rates
- Positive Environmental Impact Resulting from NGS sun-setting
- NTUA can assist off-taker in meeting wholesale energy acquisition from minority/tribal sources

LARGE SCALE RENEWABLE DEVELOPMENT PROSPECT

- NTUA proposes to co-develop up to 500MW of Solar Energy in coordination with a partner
 - Looking for Offtaker
 - Minimum project size 100MW
 - Seeking 51%-49% Partnership
- Project location would allow for direct inter-tie to transmission
- NTUA/NN possesses site control
 NTUA would complete environmental permitting
